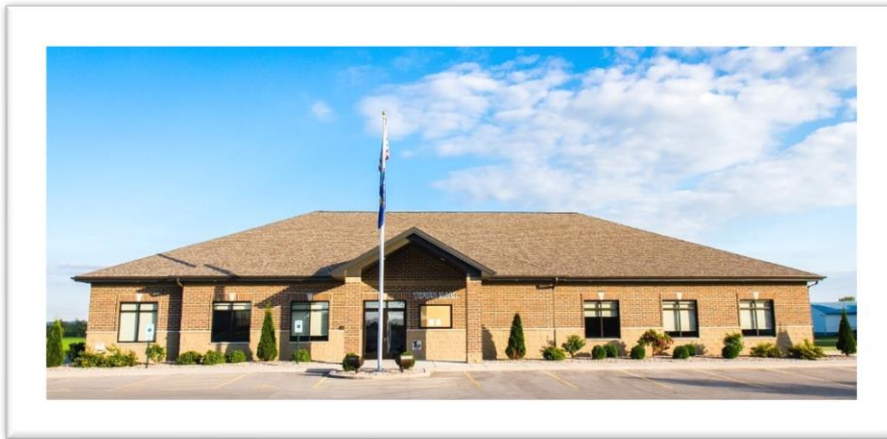

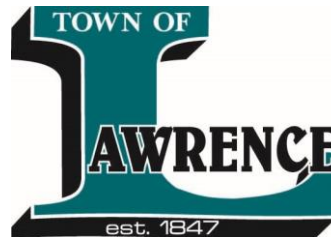

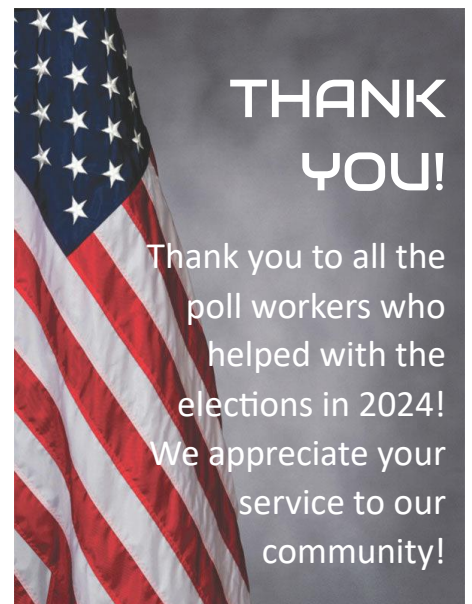
## General Election Turnout

Lawrence Registered Voters: 5,067

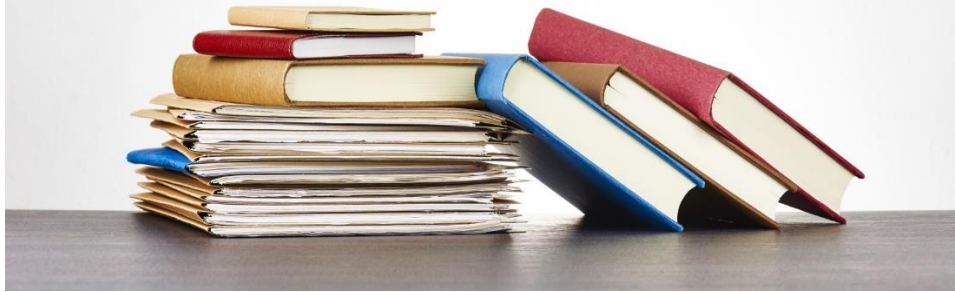
Lawrence Votes Casted: 4,545

### Animal Services Program

The Town has recently entered into an agreement with the Citizen Animal Response Team (CART). CART handles stray animals, works to reunite lost pets, assists with injured and nuisance wildlife.



### Stray Animals

If you have found a stray, please call Brown County Dispatch at (920) 391-7450 option 8. The animal will be taken to the Wisconsin Humane Society.



### If you lose a pet

Please contact the Wisconsin Humane Society at (920) 469-3110. You may also contact the HLPD by calling Brown County Dispatch at (920) 391-7450 option 8. Stray pets are held for 7 days, if no owner comes forward after the stray hold is complete, the pet is evaluated prior to be placed up for adoption.

## DOG LICENSE



All dogs over five (5) months old are required to be licensed.

**Fees:** (cash or check only)

Male or female: \$10

Spayed/Neutered: \$5

Late Fee (effective April 1<sup>st</sup>): \$5

**Bring copy of current rabies vaccination**

### Fireworks Safety Tips

- ★ Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- ★ Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.
- ★ Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- ★ Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- ★ Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- ★ Never use fireworks while impaired by alcohol or drugs.

## **TALL GRASS & WEEDS**

SUMMER TIME ALSO MEANS  
LAWN MAINTENANCE TIME.

**PER TOWN ORDINANCE 300-20(B) STATES "RESIDENTIAL LOTS SHALL BE MAINTAINED SO THAT WEEDS, NOXIOUS PLANTS, AND GRASSES DO NOT EXCEED 12 INCHES IN HEIGHT AT ANY TIME.**

NOTICES WILL BE SENT TO THE PROPERTY OWNERS WHO ARE IN VIOLATION. IF THE PROPERTY OWNER FAILS TO CUT THE TALL GRASS OR REMOVE WEEDS, CITATIONS AND PENALTIES COULD BE ENFORCED.

## **Drainage Easements: What are they and why are they important?**

A drainage easement grants the municipality the right to use a portion of the property for storm water management. An easement is detailed in property deed and is transferred with the property. It is important to note that each subdivision is designed with an engineered drainage, elevation, or grade plan. By design, storm water is directed towards property lines and/or drainage easements which typically contain catch basins or curb inlets which convey water to storm water facilities like storm water ponds. It is important to closely follow drainage plans when excavating or landscaping.

In order for drainage easements to perform as designed, they must be maintained by the property owner to assure proper function and flow of storm water. This includes mowing and keeping clear of fences, structures, trees, shrubs, landscape materials, or debris.

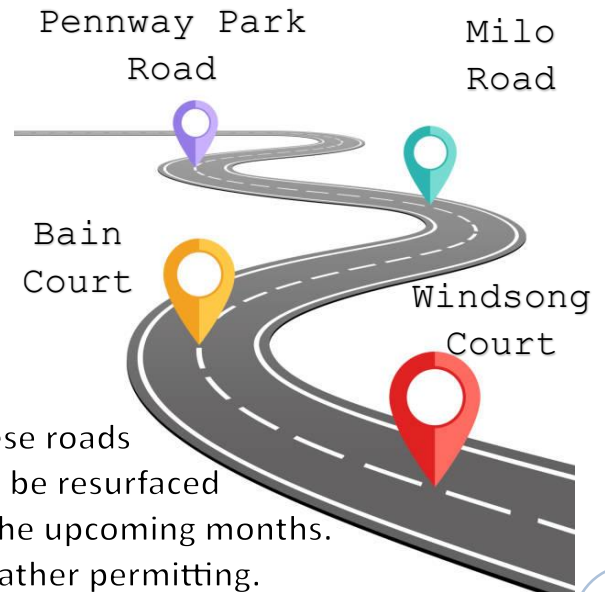


### County EE (Grant Street) – Roundabout

### NO CHURN 3 INGREDIENT ICE CREAM

2 CUPS CHILLED HEAVY WHIPPING CREAM  
¾ TSP VANILLA BEAN PASTE OR 1 TSP VANILLA EXTRACT  
1-14OZ CAN SWEETENED CONDENSED MILK

- CHILL LOAF PAN IN FREEZER.
- ADD THE HEAVY WHIPPING CREAM TO A BOWL. WHIP ON MEDIUM/HIGH SPEED UNTIL SLIGHTLY THICKENED, THEN ADD VANILLA PASTE/EXTRACT. CONTINUE WHIPPING UNTIL STIFF PEAKS FORM.
- GENTLY FOLD IN HALF OF SWEETENED CONDENSED MILK. ONCE COMBINED, FOLD IN THE REMAINING SWEETENED CONDENSED MILK.
- TRANSFER THE ICE CREAM MIXTURE TO THE CHILLED LOAF PAN. COVER THE TOP WITH PARCHMENT PAPER, THEN WRAP THE PAN TIGHTLY WITH ALUMINUM FOIL.FREEZE UNTIL SET. (6 HOURS OF OVERNIGHT)
- ADD YOUR FAVORITE TOPPINGS.ENJOY!

1-11.2OZ CAN SWEETENED CONDENSED COCONUT MILK  
SMALL PINCH OF SALT

- LINE A LOAF PAN WITH PARCHMENT PAPER.
- CHILL THE LINED LOAF PAN IN FREEZER.
- ADD INGREDIENTS TO A BLENDER AND BLEND UNTIL SMOOTH.
- TRANSFER THE ICE CREAM MIXTURE TO THE LINED LOAF PAN. PLACE PAN IN THE FREEZER FOR AT LEAST 6 HOURS.

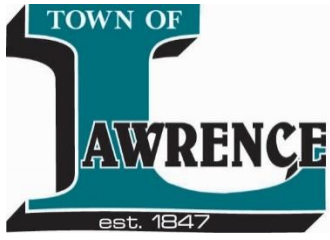
